## **1. Welcome and apologies for absence**

The Chair welcomed the participants.

Apologies were received from Beatrice Grasland (France), Eoin Ryan (Ireland) and Marina Marini (European Commission, DG SANTE).

## **4. Agreement of the minutes of the 2nd meeting of the Network on Porcine Epidemic Diarrhoea (PED) for the project: 'Request for scientific and technical assistance on the collection and review of updated scientific epidemiological data on porcine epidemic diarrhoea (PED)' held on 31 March 2015, by web-conference.** The minutes were agreed.

## **5. Topics for discussion**

### **5.1 Completing the Data reporting template**

A live demonstration was held on how to complete the template and to export an .xml file for data submission.

### **5.2 Submission to the DCF**

A live demonstration was held on how to access and submit data to the EFSA DCF system.

### **5.3 Practicalities of data reporting**

Network members should nominate a person who will be providing data to EFSA from their country for this project. This person will be given access to the EFSA DCF system for this purpose. Some concerns were raised about the reporting of data from individual farms. Since PED is not a notifiable disease, some data may be available only from private laboratories, organisations and farms. It is very probable that some countries will not be able to report herd-level data but only an overview of data that are summarised at the country level. EFSA can inquire about the willingness of private organisations or companies/farms to participate in the data collection, given that Network members can send to EFSA the contact details on the organisations/companies that need to be contacted. The issue of serological testing was also discussed. There are still concerns about the specificity of some of the serological tests that can be used. Some results are sometimes doubtful and it is not clear how they should be interpreted. It was mentioned that Dr. Berend Jan Bosch from the Department of Virology at Utrecht University might be contacted in order to inquire about a ELISA test (specificity>99%), based on purified part of S-antigen. Denmark indicated that the DTU National Veterinary Institute has a blocking ELISA with very high specificity, offering to retest samples that have yielded doubtful results for other Network members who might be interested. Further discussion of serological testing might be necessary within this Network.
