

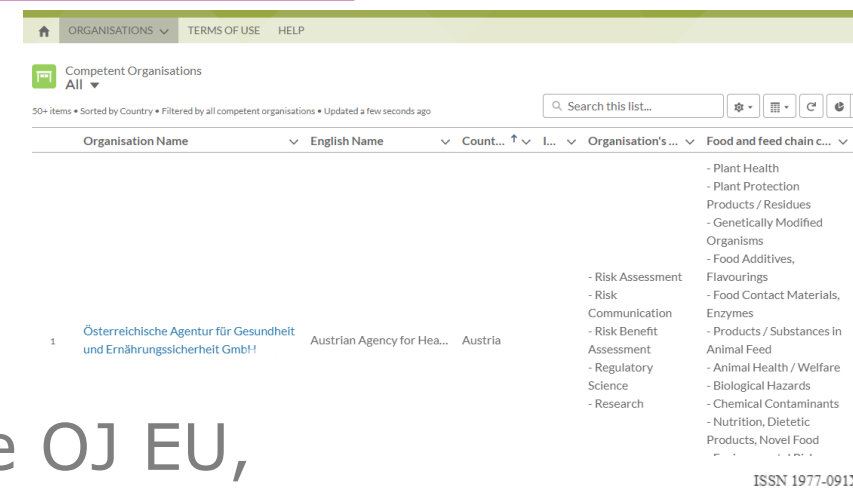
Regular MB-meetings in 2020: mid Jun., mid Oct and mid Dec. + written procedure

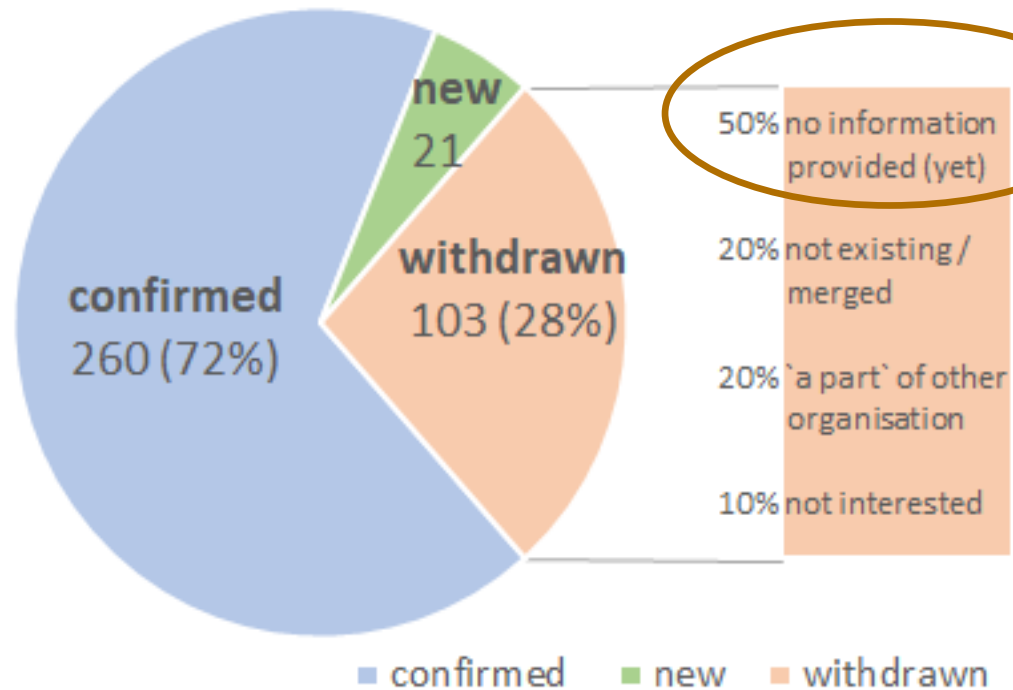

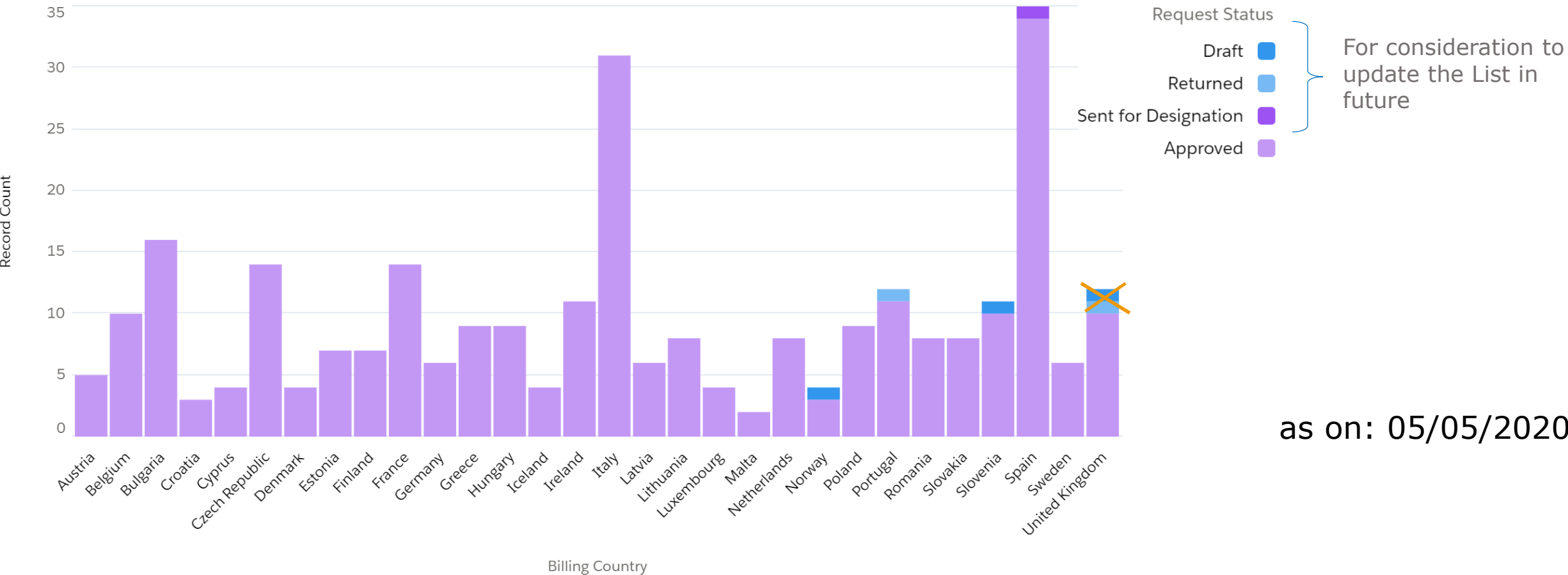

Status of organisations (ARs) in the tool

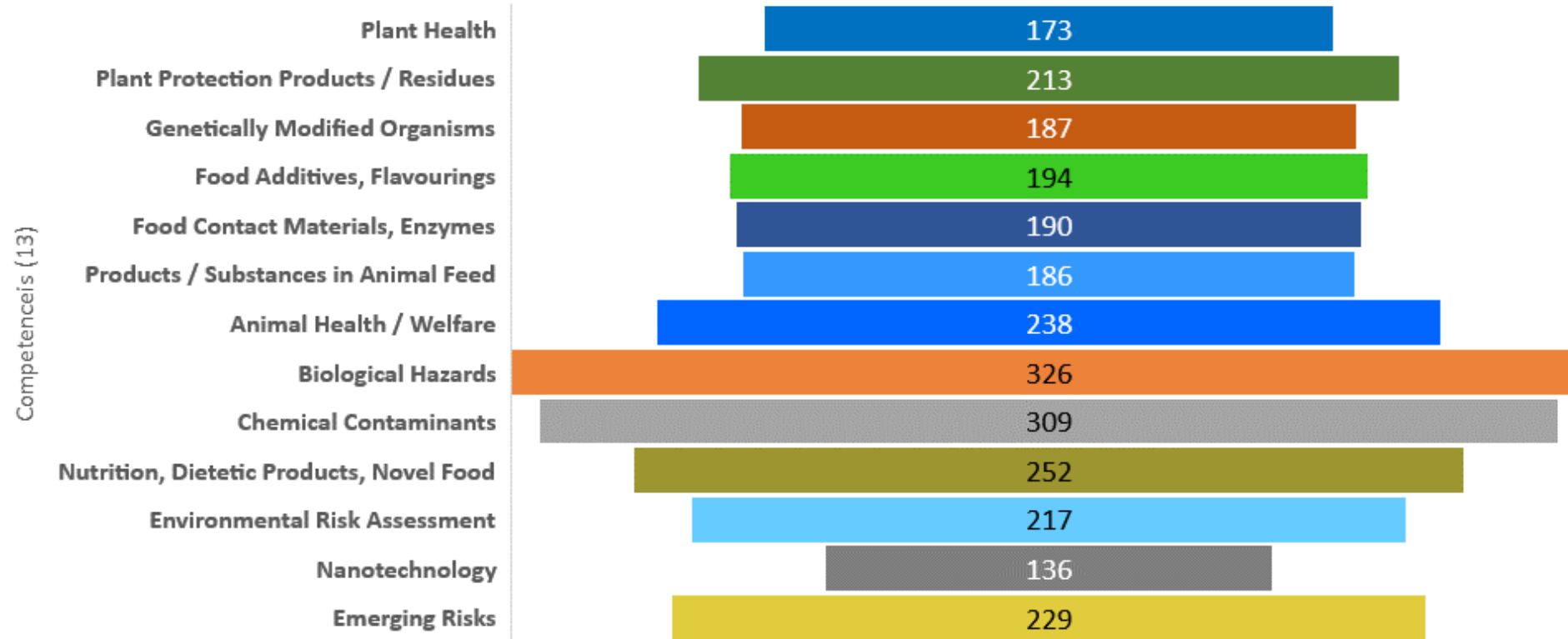

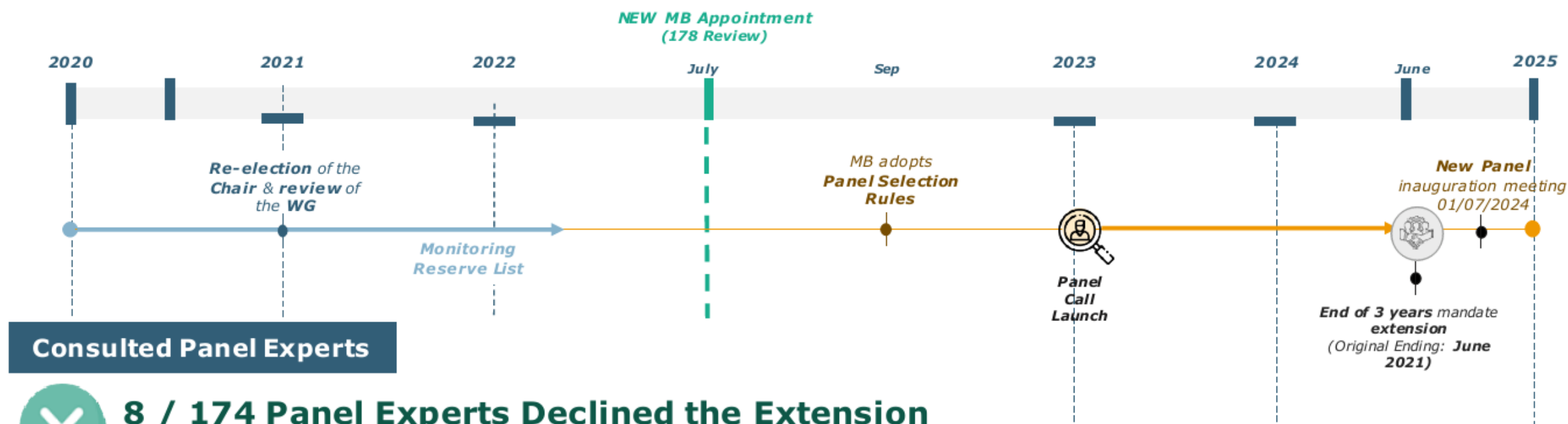
Panel Mandates Extension

ref. information from last AF meeting

The **Transparency Regulation** has also foreseen the appointment of a **new Management Board (MB)** in **June 2022**.

To **Comply with the TR measures and ensure an effective selection process** the **Panel Mandate was extended** for an **additional 3 years** to allow retro-planning to coincide with the new MB appointment in accordance with DG SANTE.

Panel Experts were recently **requested to accept or decline the extension**, allowing EFSA the opportunity to plan ahead.



8 / 174 Panel Experts Declined the Extension

NO ad-hoc call needed: Reserve List meet the needs.

Unit-costs for **staff costs**, travel and subsistence allowances in grants foresees bi-annual adaptation of unit costs.

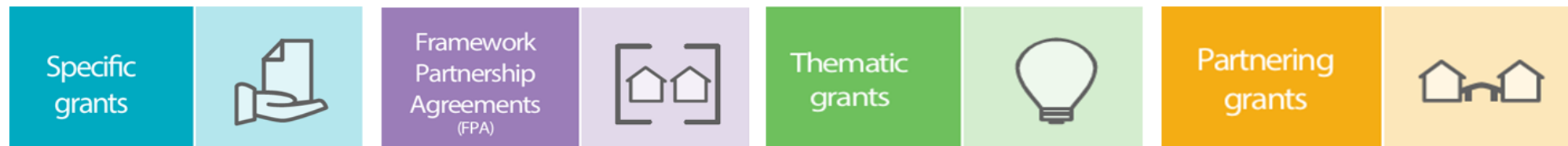

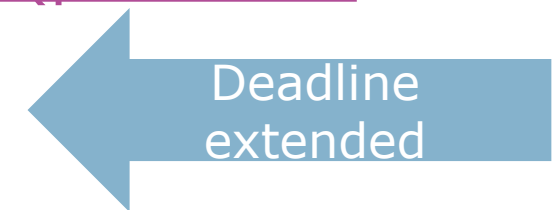

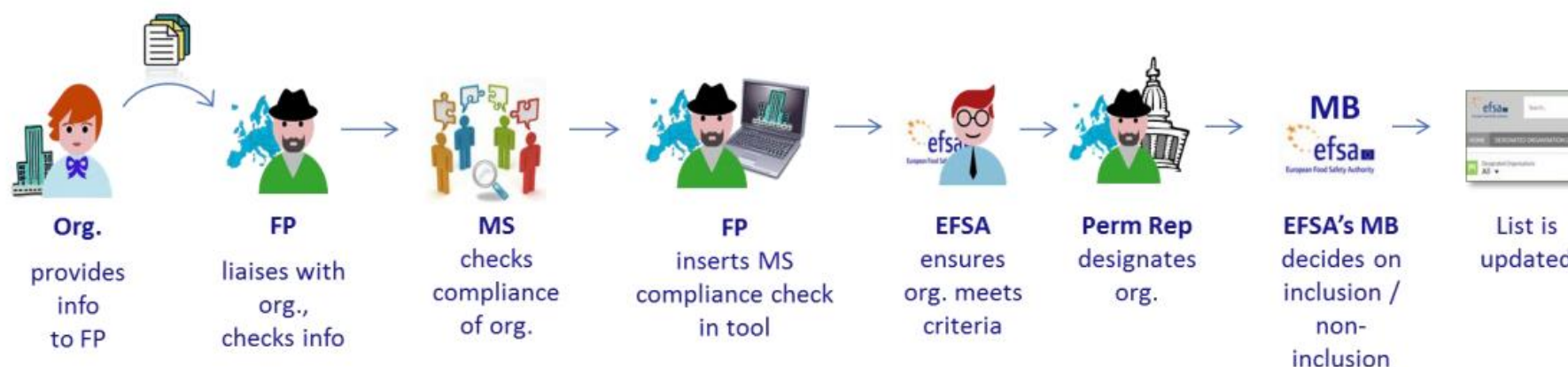
“In order to achieve the main objective of the Call, the proposal must be submitted by a consortium of a minimum of **two eligible organisations**, from **two different EU countries, Norway or Iceland**. One of the organisations must be identified in the proposal as the consortium leader (**applicant**). The applicant is responsible for identifying the other **consortium partner(s)**. Applicants may search for consortium partner(s) through: 1) their designated Article 36 organisation`s contact person having granted the access to the CompOrg-DB Tool⁷ and/or 2) their respective EFSA national Focal Point⁸. EFSA national Focal Points are having the role to support and facilitate the creation of consortia acting as a networking interface between national organisations (e.g. having access to EFSA databases of contacts, project ideas and others networking activities facilitating MS engagement in fields of EFSA`s remit). ”

EFSA Grant Calls Specifications

“Only applicable if the applicant or partner/s are not already included on the Art 36 list of competent organisations:

The evidence that an organisation has taken “*the necessary steps for inclusion*” in the List of competent organisations designated by MS **prior the deadline of the call** is the creation of the “**initial Assessment Request**” by the Admin Contact Person of the organisation in the online CompOrg-tool before the call deadline. Practically to reach that stage it means that the **interested applying organisation** has completed the following **3 steps**:

1. contacted EFSA national Focal Point (FP) and provided it with the requested information for assessment of their compliance with the criteria for inclusion in the List;
2. answered (if any) additional request(s) for information, on which base the respective FP could have positively concluded their assessment against the criteria of inclusion;
3. accessed actively the newly created profile/account of the organisation in the tool online, and specifically:
 - a. inserted the **contact details** of the organisation (also per competences)
 - b. generated the “**initial Assessment Request**”, what would bring the *workflow in the tool to the FP level*.

Step 3 can only be performed when access has been granted to a nominated individual within the applicant organisation, a so called “Admin. Contact Person”, who is assigned licence/user access credentials to the tool (initiated by Focal Point, via EFSA Service Desk).

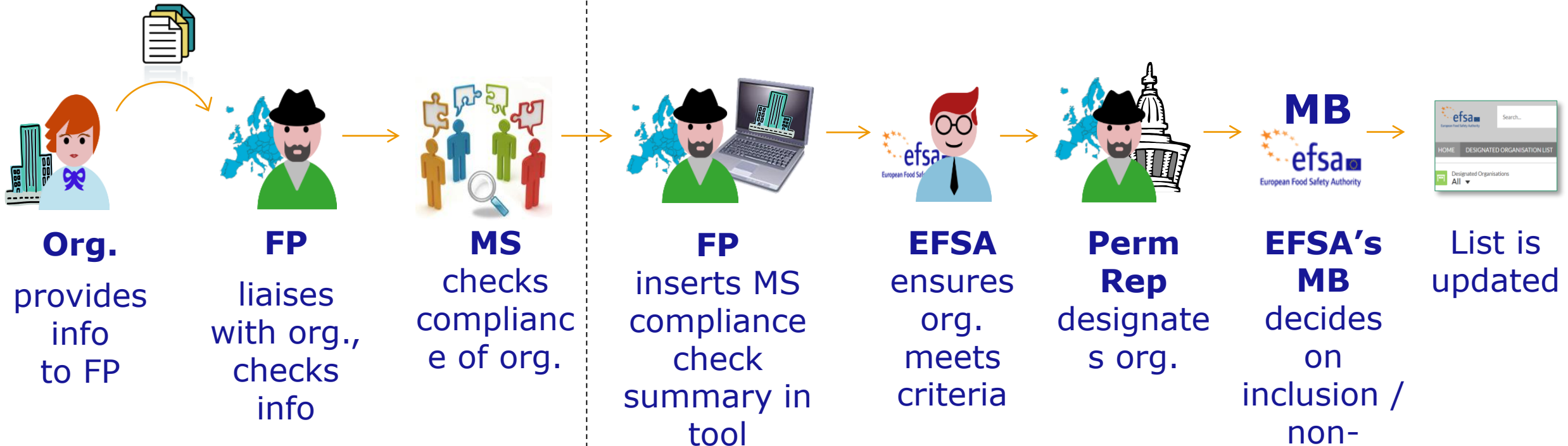
Applicants should initiate this procedure as early as possible to allow completion of all 3 steps by the call deadline. ”

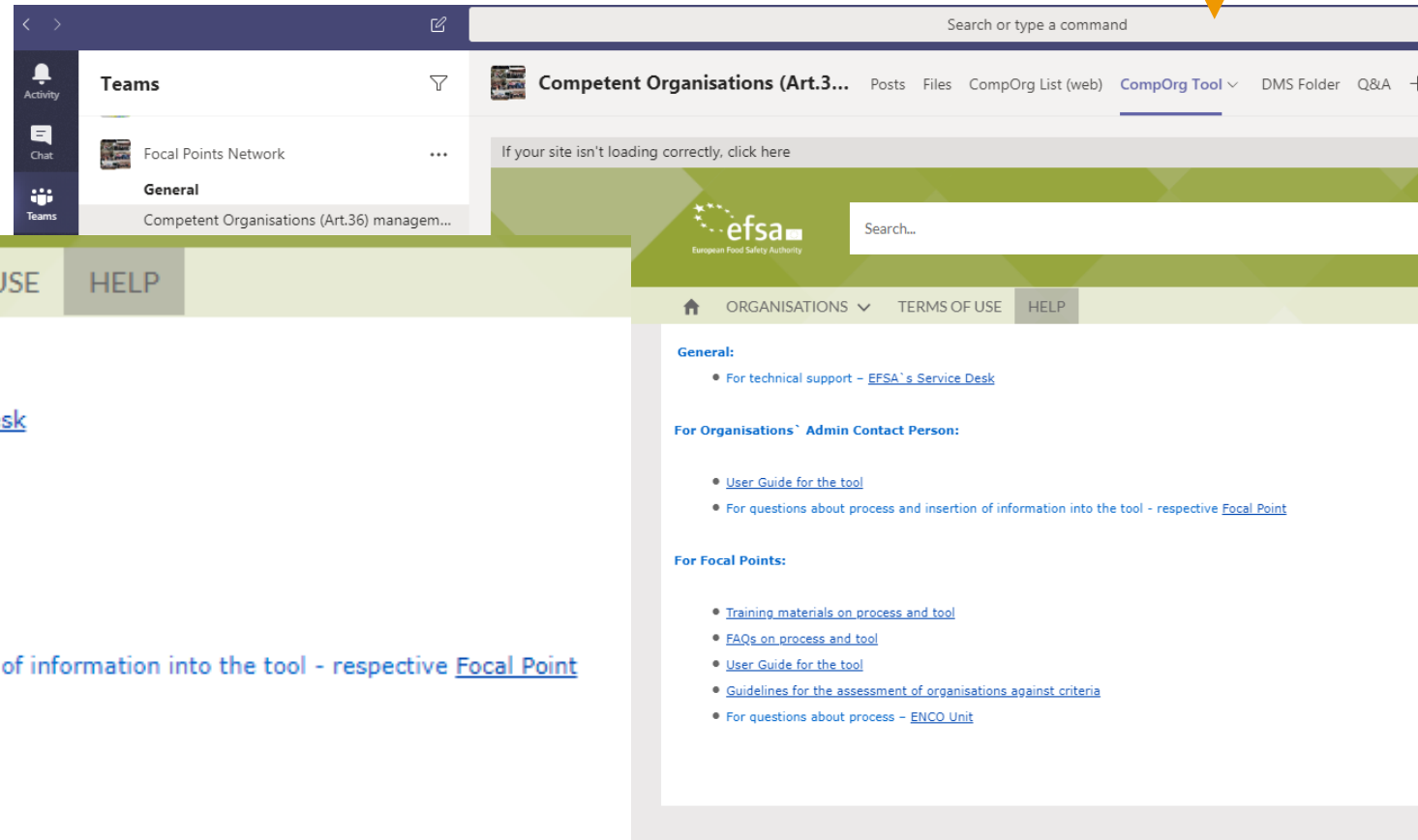
