OVERVIEW IN NUMBERS

- Delphi study (Dec 2015) identified 28 MS priorities
- Good overlap MS / EFSA 2020 priorities (17/28)
- **36 Joint Projects** over 2015 2017 (ED visit, Thematic / Partnering grants)
- **75 partners** from 24 countries involved
- Joint Projects related to 16/28 MS priorities
- 10 projects from EU RAA Catalogue
- Total EFSA **support around 7M Euro** (range 26 k 1,2 M Euro)


