

Joint statement AF - EFSA

In view of the above, EFSA and its Advisory Forum wish to declare their commitment to supporting the European Research Area by:

- Stimulating new partnerships in food safety risk assessment
- Supporting the formation of research consortia, for example through the network of EFSA national Focal Points
- Informing the setting of research agendas based on the knowledge and research gaps identified in risk assessments
- Offering the regulatory science context that assesses the latest scientific findings to inform policy decisions
- Maintaining operational scientific networks with representatives from all Member States that identify knowledge gaps and establish partnerships
- · Being active partners in international cooperation
- Training and enabling the mobility of researchers
- Contributing to Open Data portals and improving data interoperability, advancing the application of machine learning and artificial intelligence

The AF invites the Commission services and national research policy makers and funding programmes to use the outcomes of the RARA to inform their future research agenda setting activities.

Furthermore, EFSA and the AF call for more public investment in food safety research, including the formation of strategic partnerships in the area of food safety, such as European Joint Programmes, European Research Infrastructure Consortia (ERICs), and other initiatives.

ToR Programme Committee - Tasks



- Programme Committee will direct preparation of the 2nd Risk Assessment Research Assembly (RARA). Specific tasks include:
 - Agreeing objectives, venue, date, length and format of the event
 - Developing the programme of the event and identifying key actors (e.g. involving the relevant national, regional & EU research agenda setters / funders and the wider risk assessment community (e.g. Article 36 organisations, academia).
 - Preparing supporting actions to the event (e.g. a renewed AF statement)
 - Review outputs from the event and make recommendations for a future event.
- In addition to the preparation tasks for the RARA event, the Programme Committee may be used as a sounding board for food safety research related matters.

Objectives RARA2020



- Building synergies to enable regulatory research outputs to support the achievement of the SDGs
- Foster alignment of EU and national (and regional)
 R&I investments to deliver research outputs that inform regulatory science and future policies
- Networking and relationship building in the wider food safety risk assessment ecosystem
