The workshop was organized and financed by the TAIEX financial instrument of the European Commission, in close cooperation with DG SANCO, EFSA and EEAS.

The audience consisted of approximately 25 representatives from the competent veterinary authorities of Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Egypt, Israel, Palestine, Jordan and Lebanon. OIE (headquarters and regional office) and FAO (regional office) were represented, as well as the EU-FMD Commission.

A detailed agenda and a list of participants are attached to this report. All presentations are available through TAIEX.

The objective of the workshop was (1) to take stock of ongoing and planned activities in animal disease management in the Southern Mediterranean region (2) to provide an opportunity to strengthen collaboration between the different veterinary services and organisations and (3) to identify proposals that can guide future programming under the EU Neighbourhood Policy.

The workshop met all expectations. Discussions and interactions were animated and informative. Many contacts were made between participants and a follow-up was considered highly desirable in many contributions.

The following recommendations were made:

#### Working group on cross-border cooperation for animal health

- Agree to share all PVS Reports and Gap Analyses conducted through OIE and enable their evaluation on a regional scale. Such an exercise could greatly help programming on a risk basis.
- Exchange information on Animal Identification Systems in each country. Build systems adapted to the needs in all countries of the region, keeping in mind the goal of linking id and health status (e.g. vaccination), especially for the animals traded.
- Use geospatial information to identify main routes of animal transport, places of border crossing, and major watering and grazing places in the region to help focus surveillance.
- Work towards harmonisation of control strategies for FMD, Rift Valley Fever and PPR, which are considered top priority;







- Develop harmonised vaccination protocols;
- Establish regional vaccine or antigen stocks/bank or emergency intervention stocks;
- Organise annual regional meetings on the three diseases, following the example of the REMESA-CPC activity, or of FMD in Eastern Europe, in order to exchange and adapt the strategies.

#### Working group on Diagnostic Capacity

- Twinning projects with laboratories have proven very successful.
   Support should continue.
- Sharing of PVS Reports and Gap Analyses and the evaluation on a regional scale will foster collaboration and help to create synergies.
- Focal points for laboratories should be formally nominated in each country through the respective OIE Delegate. This will greatly facilitate the dissemination of information.
- Through such a network of focal points, annual seminars can be organised on selected topics.

#### **Working group on Trade**

- The TRACES system should be implemented throughout the region for EU imports of products of animal origin. Applications may be made to use TRACES for imports in the countries of the region and for intra-regional trade.
- Contingency plans should be established for priority diseases in order to minimise effects of disease outbreaks on regional trade.
- Guidelines and procedures should be developed in order to implement international SPS standards.

Aim of the meeting

The objective of the workshop is to take stock of ongoing and planned activities in animal disease management that are aimed at expanding trade in products of animal origin in the Southern Mediterranean region. The workshop will provide an opportunity to strengthen collaboration between the different veterinary services and organisations and to identify shared priorities that can guide future programming under the EU Neighbourhood Policy.

The audience will consist of approximately 25 representatives from the competent veterinary authorities in the 10 Mediterranean Neighbourhood countries.

The Mediterranean ENP countries are invited to inform about their ongoing programs for animal disease control, and to identify their priority issues in domestic production, export and import. Speakers from OIE and FAO will present their ongoing programs and activities in animal health control in the Southern Mediterranean Region, including the relevant programs under the Global Framework for the progressive control of Trans-boundary Animal Diseases (GF-TAD). DG SANCO will explain the legal aspects of animal health control measures relevant for EU market access and EFSA will present its mechanisms on risk assessment and communication.
