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



# The new FP framework: how does it work? **Principal activities**



Planning of principal activities (Q4)

Payment of the balance

Signature of the specific agreement (Q4)

- Reporting
  (January of the subsequent year)
- Start of the implementa tion of the principal activities (January)
- Pre-financing (**70%** from planned grant)

- 1. Planning period in Q4
- 2. Signature period for the specific agreements in Q4
- 3. Pre-financing (70% from the planned grant)
- **4. Implementation** period coincide with the **year** in subject (e.g. 2023)
- **5. Reporting** period in January of the subsequent year
- 6. Payment of the balance (once the report is approved)

# The new FP framework: how does it work? **Tailor-made activities**



## Which kind of proposals can MS submit?

- Activities/projects with collaborative nature (all MS can express interest in joining the project during a specific planning period)
- Activities/projects addressing country-based priorities to be implemented by a single country or a group of MS
- Under EFSA remit and fitting under overarching areas of FP work




# Which kind of information does EFSA need from MS submitting a proposal?

- ✓ Background and objectives
- ✓ List of activities and deliverables
- ✓ Estimated budget
- ✓ Duration and activity timeframe
- ✓ Contact person
- ✓ Indication on if it is a country based proposal or proposal with a collaborative nature

## The new FP framework: how does it work? **Tailor-made activities**



How to submit a proposal for a tailor- made activity



- 1. Submission phase: 3 indicative "windows" throughout the year for MS to put forward their proposals through the Focal Points
- 2. Assessment phase performed by EFSA and with consultation of the MS. It concludes with a feedback to the proposing MS
- 3. Overview of approved proposals is presented to the MS and included in a repository file
- **4. \*Planning exercise:** 2 indicative window for the planning exercises (Q2 and Q4) throughout the year- applicable only if the proposal has collaborative nature (meant to be open for expression of interests of all MS)
- 5. Signature

# Knowledge and information management and support to scientific production

## Developing supporting material for the functioning of the FP network

- Development and/or update of guidelines for FP to ensure coherent processes and efficiency within the FP network
- Developing an onboarding program for new FP and mentoring program for all FP

#### **BfR World Food Safety Almanac**

- Develop a concept for maintaining the country profile in the almanac to ensure the almanac is up-to-date
- Promote the almanac, collect feedback and identify **bottlenecks**



## **Engagement, collaboration and partnerships**

Organisation of training sessions/workshops/info-sessions/capacity building activities to other FPs and/or other actors on the **Grants** and **Procurements.** 

Support actions and the identification of tools/methodologies/approaches to foster **joint planning** of specific risk assessment activities and identification of possible means.

Effective **knowledge transfer** across the RA community: facilitation of knowledge sharing and promotion of RA tools and methodologies in select areas of RA.

Support in the creation of Partnerships and promotion of national engagement opportunities via focused **networking activities**.



## **Capacity Building**

European Excellence Label – criteria and RA expert involvement Sets up criteria for trainings to be advertised through the label. It also sets up and steers the peer review process involving EU RA experts.



Connecting hub between the EEL-team and the SG with training providers, employers and learners.

#### European Excellence Label – web platform

Concerns design, set-up, function, hosting aspects and potentially with researching legal aspects, and the preparation of the procurement process for an external web hosting provider

## **Data**

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#### **Data Flow Mapping Methodology**

To support development and execution of a methodology to map the flow of data in a Member State.

#### **Data Flow Mapping in a Member State**

Document the flow of data in Member State including identification of pain points where automated tools could improve data quality or speed or reduce costs or human activity. Specific data domains can be specified if preferred.


#### **Coordinated Communication (CoCo)**

- Develop a guidance including roles & responsibilities and examples of best practice on how CEN and FP can best work together at MS level
- Develop a model of the **EU CoCo community**
- MS Communication Coordinators launch fully-funded pilots in interested MS

- Food poisoning/listeria risk for pregnant women

# Overview of country-specific tailor-made activities

#### **ImproRisk Model – Cyprus**

Sharing and promotion of the ImproRisk Model as an open access **risk** assessment tool and fostering of the effective **knowledge transfer** across the EU Member States and IPA countries.
