The working group also considered the draft 14th pilot EFSA Plant Health Scientific Newsletter that includes links to articles found in the MEDISYS platform as well as articles found through the searches carried out in the Scopus database.

The inclusion of three scientific articles was carefully discussed with the experts. The final decision was to keep two of the discussed articles, even if they do not comply completely with the usual criteria for selection. Indeed, one article focuses on copper <u>not</u> protecting tobacco against *Xylella fastidiosa*. Normally, only articles on control measures that are effective against a pest are included. Nevertheless, given the specific case (*Xylella fastidiosa*), the article was considered of interest to risk managers.

The second article reported the mutualistic interaction between the *Southern tomato virus* and the tomato plant. In general, articles are included in the newsletters when regarding organisms that are known to be pathogenic or whose pathogenicity is evident. However, in this case, the information on the non-pathogenicity seemed of interest as a follow-up to what reported by previous editions. The following PAFF on 19th of February confirmed the articles' relevance, during the Newsletters' presentation.

The article regarding *Cladobotryum protrusum*, a fungus which parasites cultivated mushrooms, already discussed during the 23^{rd} Working Group, was finally included in the 14^{th} pilot Scientific Newsletter.

In conclusion, as commonly agreed, the new filter "Annex II Part A Begomoviruses" was created on the Medysis platfrom, in order to monitor the Begomoviruses listed in the annex IIA of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2072.
