V.Scientific topic(s) for discussion

a. Draft opinion on the possible alignment of the BSE monitoring and surveillance requirements in the EU with the revised Terrestrial Code Chapter of WOAH (EFSA-Q-2025-00443)

The chair started the meeting welcoming the EFSA scientific officer who will coordinate the mandate from January 2026. Next the chair shared the feedback by AHAW Panel on the protocol, which was successfully approved by written procedure. During the meeting the working group reviewed BSE surveillance protocols, retrospective case analysis, and future surveillance strategies. Key points included high uncertainty in detecting cases under WOAH criteria, with most historical cases likely missed. The group discussed generic and additional surveillance objectives like the detection of atypical BSE, monitoring trends, and maintaining diagnostic capacity, while reducing unnecessary testing. Modeling showed classical BSE is nearly non-existent in the EU, whereas atypical cases persist mainly in older fallen stock. Different alternatives to the WOAH approach were proposed to balance sensitivity and cost, alongside supplementary measures like syndromic surveillance. Emphasis was placed on clear objectives, proportionality, and quality control. The group also finalized the questionnaire to be delivered and discussed with the members of the TSE subgroup of the EFSA's Animal Health Network, whose results are to be analyzed and potentially incorporated into the opinion.

2nd WG meeting on the request for a scientific opinion on the possible alignment of the BSE monitoring and surveillance requirements laid down in Regulation (EC) No 999/2001 with the revised Terrestrial Code Chapter 11.4. of the World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH)

V. Scientific topic(s) for discussion

a. Draft opinion on the possible alignment of the BSE monitoring and surveillance requirements in the EU with the revised Terrestrial Code Chapter of WOAH (EFSA-0-2025-00443)

The meeting discussions focused on refining the draft protocol in preparation for submission to the AHAW Panel. The first review of the draft opinion was conducted that includes general sections so far. Key discussions included aligning WOAH's non-prescriptive surveillance framework with EU implementation needs, evaluating the sensitivity of clinical-based surveillance, and reviewing retrospective case data to estimate detection capacity. The group agreed to consolidate assessment questions, clarify the purpose of surveillance and refine the assessment of the BSE cases confirmed in the EU since 2015, incorporate modelling to estimate infection prevalence in the EU27. Following the discussions changes were made in the body of the text on the draft protocol and the draft opinion.

VI. Any other business

The group planned a stakeholder consultation via the EFSA TSE Network to gather input on awareness and surveillance implementation challenges. The results will be included in the scientific output. The questionnaire will be discussed in the next working group meeting. The Chair thanked the participants and closed the meeting.
