

### **Executive Summary**

The simulation exercise (SimEx) "Infant menace" was developed by ECDC and conducted in the framework of Art. 20 of the Serious Cross-Border Threats to Health (SCBTH) Regulation. The primary aim was to test inter-agency collaboration in the development of a joint Rapid Risk Assessment (RRA) and Lines-to-Take (LTT) in response to a simulated cross-border health threat.



### 2026 EXTERNAL CRISIS PREPAREDNESS EXERCISE

- Aim: strengthen the network of MS, IPA countries, EC and EU Agencies in the framework of responding to a crisis in the area of EFSA's remit
- Target group:
  - Risk assessors, risk/crisis managers, and risk communicators of a number of MS
  - Risk assessors and risk communicators of European Agencies
  - Risk/crisis managers and risk communicators of EC
- 2026 thematic: Agroterrorism disruption of food/feed manufacturing/ distribution
- Grant to cover the costs linked to the organisation and hosting of the exercise

When a crisis hits, borders don't matter - collaboration does.

Today, together with our valued partner the German Federal Institute for Risk Assessment (Bundesinstitut für Risikobewertung), we are co-hosting the 2025 Crisis Preparedness Exercise in Berlin DE.

Over three days, experts and authorities from across Europe will test readiness to respond to vector-borne zoonotic diseases, working under a One Health approach.
