- EFSA has risk assessment and a risk communication mandate
- Transparency and openness are 2 of EFSA's core values

Why is transparency important?



- Generating trust (confidence) in the independence, soundness and rigour of its advice
- Underpinning scientific clarity and excellence
- Engaging with all its stakeholders, including European consumers and the wider scientific community

Information access



- To what extent data and information related to the scientific decisionmaking process can be made available to the broader scientific community and interested parties, when and how this could be done?
- Access to replicable research, usable and editable data
- Transparency of RA process before it reaches a conclusion
- Divided discussion different requirements and concerns from NGOs and industry
- Public domain/confidential information?

Engagement of stakeholders



- The extent to which engagement of stakeholders during the decisionmaking process including public consultation and open plenary meetings, would be of mutual benefit for EFSA and stakeholders?
- Difference of views across stakeholders
- Want greater procedural clarity, timeframe and sequence
- Mandates engage relevant (?) stakeholders
- Pre-submission meetings accountability, publicly available records, rules of engagement
- Open meetings, technology

Transparency of process and scientific outputs Sales European Food Safety Authority

- The extent to which and by what means transparency of EFSA's decision-making process and related scientific outputs can be further improved in order to meet stakeholders' information needs?
- Very different needs from different stakeholders (one size does not fit all)
- Common need for clear identification of RA process
- Challenge to communicate unambiguously to wide range of different stakeholders
