

EFSA Public Consultations Privacy Statement on draft scientific opinion on the risks to public health related to the presence of aflatoxins in food

1. Objective

The objective of EFSA's public consultations is to receive the views of stakeholders or people concerned by the specific topic of the consultation and to publish these on the EFSA website, under the responsibility of the Head of Unit in charge who is also the controller with regard to processing of personal data. As the public consultation process implies the collection and further processing of certain personal data, Regulation (EC) 45/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 December 2000 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Community institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data, is applicable¹.

2. Which personal information do we collect and through which technical means? Identification Data

The personal data collected and further processed are data necessary for the participation in the public consultation, such as your first and family name, affiliation, country, e-mail, including your contribution on the topic concerned. The processing of personal data linked to the organisation and management of public consultations is necessary for the management and functioning of EFSA, as mandated by EFSA's Founding Regulation².

Technical information

EFSA public consultations are carried out by means of the European Commission's official survey management tool 'EUSurvey'. The reference installation of the tool is hosted at DG DIGIT of the European Commission and contributions are collected in the DG DIGIT data centre. After the closure of the consultation, an EFSA staff member in charge downloads in a secure manner the data file with the contributions into EFSA's Document Management System with a restricted access setting on a need-to-know basis.
