

## CLARIFICATION N°4

**Call reference:** GP/EFSA/ENCO/2018/03

**Call title:** Partnering Grants

**Question:** "Co-financing: co-financing from a source other than the Union budget is required. The project costs not covered by the EFSA grant must be financed from the applicant and partner/s resources. The applicant and its partner/s must therefore contribute financially to the project. Additionally, there may be also a financial contribution from another entity, but such an entity may be only a public body. Contributions from the private sector are not permitted. "

In the case of a consortia of two or more art. 36 institutions in different countries: can the 50% co-financing come from only one of the partners, or must the co-financing come from all of the partners in the consortia?

**Answer:** The project is co-financed by EFSA at a maximum of 50% of the total eligible costs. The remaining part is co-financed by both applicant and partner/s that must contribute financially to the project. Note that EFSA does not stipulate how much each member of the consortia should contribute financially.
