ROADMAP OBJECTIVES

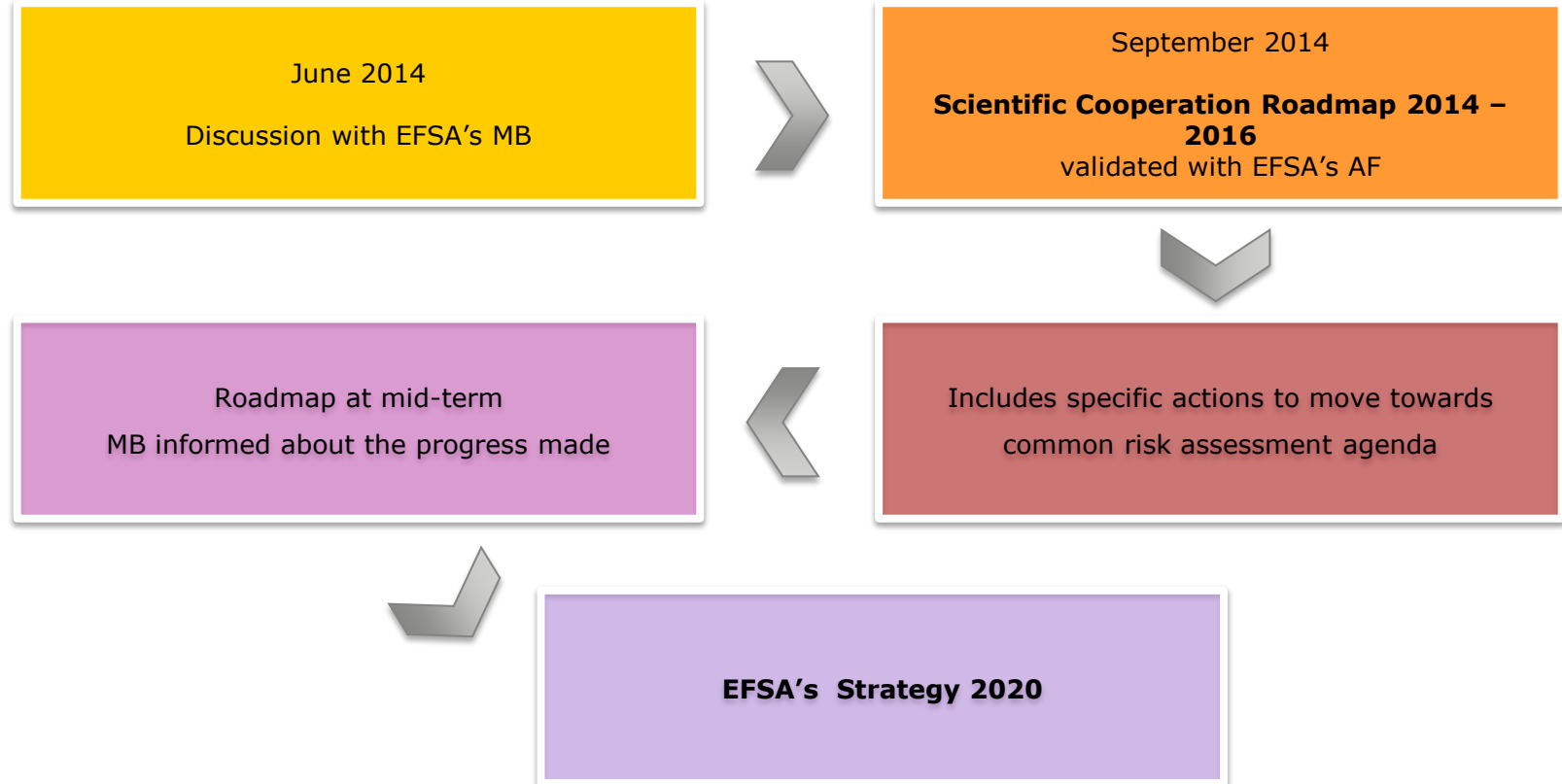
Scientific capacity building and intelligent use of resources

SCIENTIFIC COOPERATION ROADMAP 2014-2016



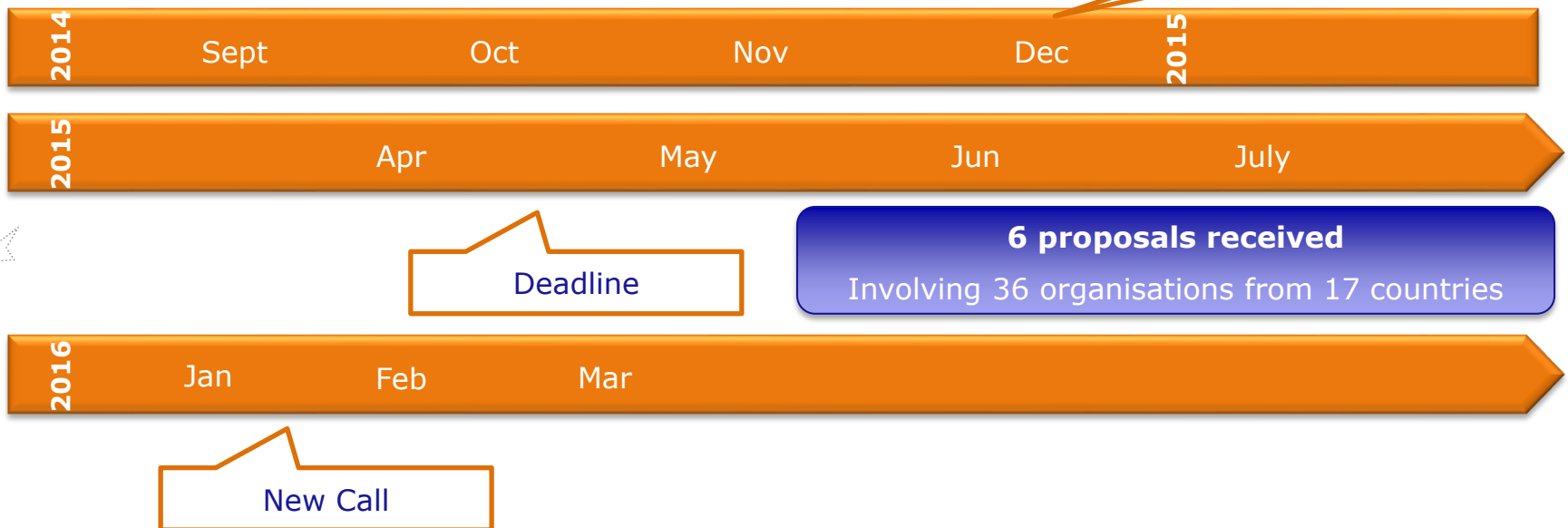

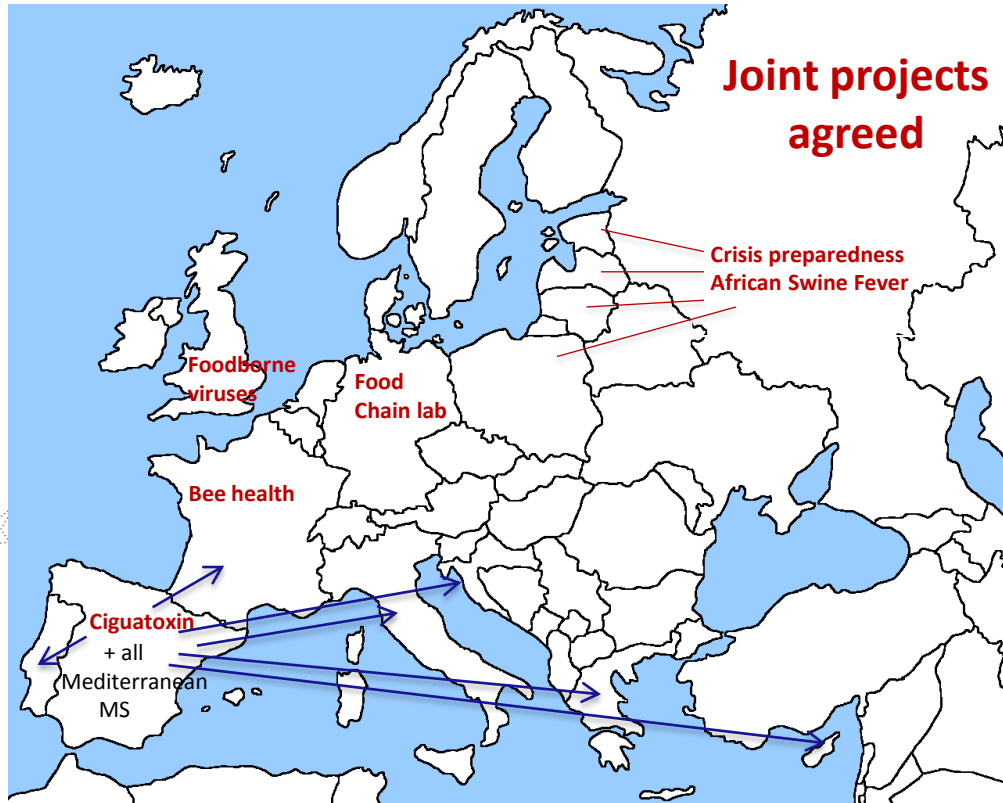
THEMATIC GRANTS

EU RISK ASSESSMENT AGENDA (RAA)

- Where priorities are defined and attained collaboratively, Member States together with EFSA

Delphi study ongoing

- Agree on common priorities involving the EFSA AF and around 150 experts across the EU Member States

AF end 2015

- Delphi findings at AF meeting in December 2015 as a basis for the first EU RAA

EU RAA

- Key tool for collaboration on priority subjects

Clustering

- Cooperation on priority topics by different MS - improved use of EU capacities and preventing doubling of work

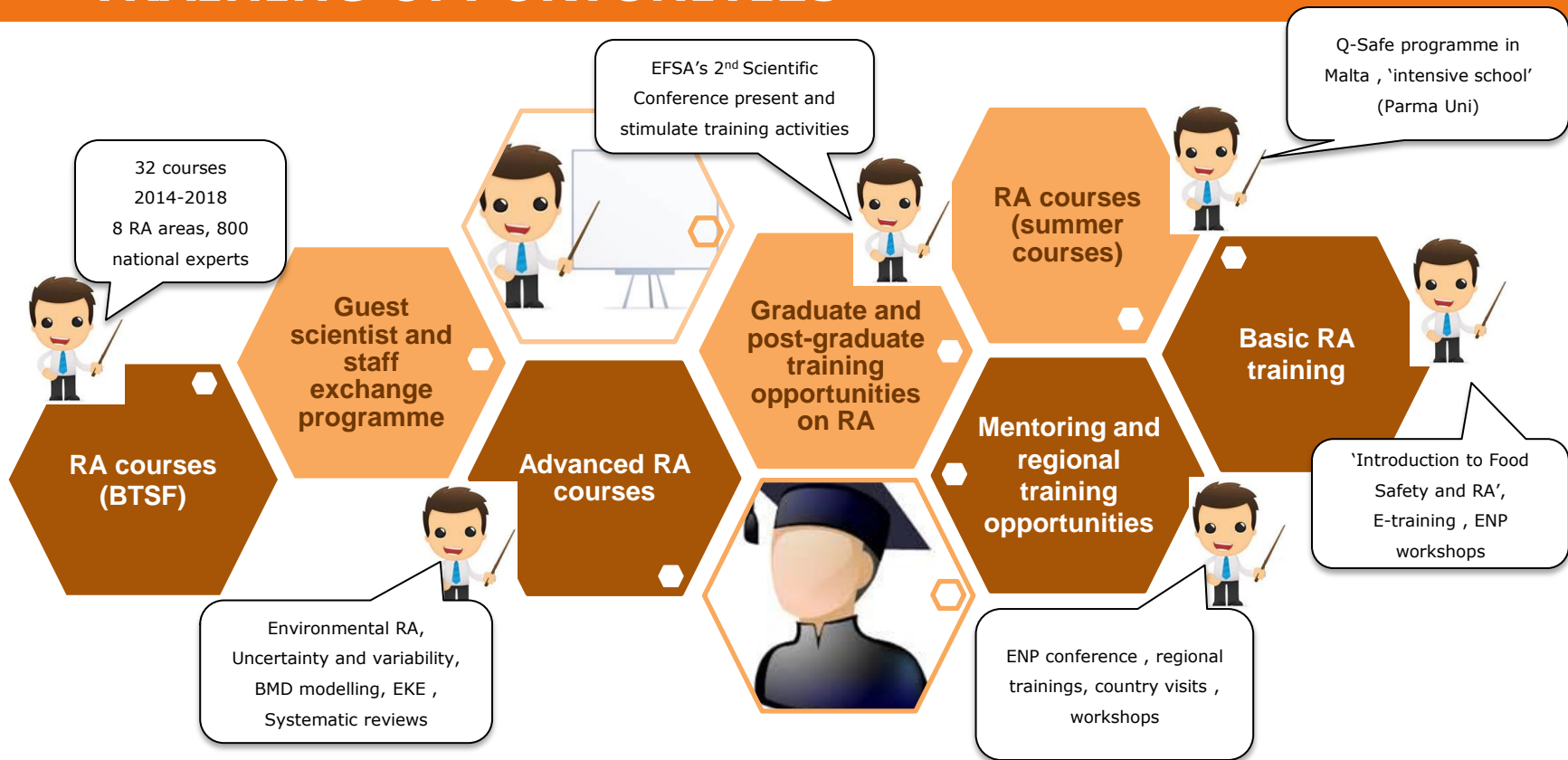
