Objectives of the Training

- Explain probabilistic expert judgements
- Recall the characteristics of EKE
- Identify tasks in risk assessment applicable for EKE, e.g. identify priorities for EKE
- Reason the use of EKE in risk assessment
- Frame a problem for EKE
- Identify, select, and motivate experts for an elicitation
- Discuss and select the appropriate elicitation method
- Define the elicitation protocol, incl. realistic resources, adaptations and selection of elicitors
- Produce background information for an elicitation (evidence dossier)
- Decide on training needs for the experts
- Recall typical protocols using different elicitation methods (evt. software), incl. the Sheffield method, the Delphi method and the Cooke method
- Document and interpret results; discuss and handle risks of elicitations
- Produce a complete documentation of an EKE
- Discuss handling of confidentiality during an EKE
