Transparency in Medicine

- Essential
 - for "shared decision making"
 - Trust in the profession
 - Trustworthyness of the chain of care(-takers)
 - Safety

Transparency in Medicine

- Transparency is limited when it comes to trust and open access of healthcare in other words in preserving "patient's privacy"...
- Reluctance in Transparency when things went wrong or faults were made, is linked to concerns on reputation and liability



Transparency in Food Safety

- Parallels and differences
 - Consumers need to trust the food-producers
 - Producers are in competition and safetyrequirements should protect their position on the markets
 - But controlling agencies should have full access to all the data... with security guaranties



Transparency in Food Safety

- So in transparency two levels should be discerned:
 - 1. Absolute transparency within the limits of secrecy with in first instance a "non-punitive" approach
 - Understandable and open information should be available with respect for marketing position of the food-producers
