#### Bee Week 2017

■ European Parliament tasked EFSA to organise bee health symposium as part of Bee Week 2017

■ The objective : to deliver a concrete result

The result: an EU Bee Partnership for collecting, sharing data on bee health involving all stakeholders.



### Why EFSA?

- June 2016 The EP's Week of Bees and Pollination (Bee Week) 2016 concluded: absence of harmonised data across the EU to help inform policy makers on what is causing increasing bee fatalities.
- Oct 2016 EFSA offered MEPs of the EP's Apiculture and Bee Health WG its advice and expertise based on the work it had so far conducted on honey bees.
- EU is global frontrunner on bee health analysis and monitoring – integration of data collection could strengthen this role



#### **SYMPOSIUM AND RESULT**

- EFSA co-organised the Bee Week 2017 symposium with key stakeholders-EPBA, BeeLife, ECPA and COPA-COGECA; involvement of NGOs, such as PAN-Europe
- Focus of symposium and subsequent actions was to be first on honey bees, with aim of expanding to include wild bees, bumblebees in future
