Proposed contributions to BPDG



- 1. Collect data of pesticide use in agriculture (in particular in sugar beet growing).
- 2. Present examples of good agricultural practices favouring bee health.
- 3. Collect information on how farmers in general and beet growers in particular provide food and habitat for bees on farmland.
- 4. Preferably in cooperation with beekeepers' associations: Present the development of voluntary initiatives bringing farmers and beekeepers together to help improve conditions for honey bees inter alia keeping beekeepers notified when neighbouring farmers are applying insecticides to their crops.
