FEEDAP - Role



The FEEDAP Panel provides independent scientific advice on the safety and/or efficacy of additives used in animal feed.

This may extend to feed materials in the future

The Panel evaluates safety for the target species, the consumer of products of animal origin, the user and the environment and/or efficacy.

The Panel performs most of its work in the context of specific authorisation procedures (on request of EC) or as a self-task.

The Panel of Experts



The 21 members of the Panel together represent over 500 years of working/research-based expertise covering:

Animal physiology, biochemistry, pharmacology, toxicology, microbiology, (animal) nutrition (including fish), veterinary sciences, feed materials and technology, husbandry, product quality, ecotoxicology.

The FEEDAP Unit



The Unit is divided in two teams:

- 1.Team Opinions. Providing scientific support to the Panel on the preparation of opinions.
- 2.Team Applications. Dealing with administrative issues linked with the applications/dossiers.

Work on Guidance



The panel worked closely with Commission staff developing the implementing rules for the feed additives directive [Regulation (EC) 429/2008]

Over the same period, the panel developed and published on the EFSA website 15 guidance documents for applicants

Help for applicants is continuously being revised and improved, reflecting both scientific progress and experience.

FEEDAP – Other interactions



Applicants are offered "Technical hearings" on the assessment process

- Pre-application meetings (usually dealt by the Unit)
- Requested during an assessment
- Requested after an assessment because of deficiencies identified preventing a final safety assessment

FEEDAP – Future workload



In addition to new applications, there will be a re-evaluation of all existing feed additives

About 2,700 additives – included in the Community register but never formally assessed or assessed according to different (national) standards. Intention is to ensure all feed additives have been assessed to a common standard

- Number of dossiers speculative
- Priority list of additives, agreed at the Standing Committee on the Food Chain and Animal Health
- Drip-fed to EFSA
