2012 challenges

- e³ programme continues : full deployment of new organisational chart and re-engineered working processes

2012 Key priorities



1- Further boost risk assessment capacity :

- Implementing the Science strategy 2011-2016
- Further engaging national food safety agencies in work related to applications
- Enhancing internal scientific capacity (Human capital strategy)

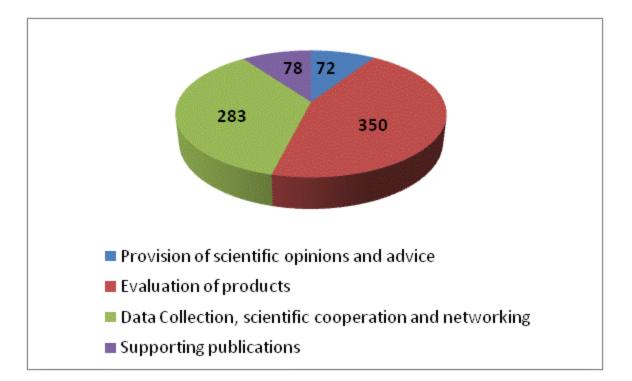
2- Fully implement Thematic approach for Communications :

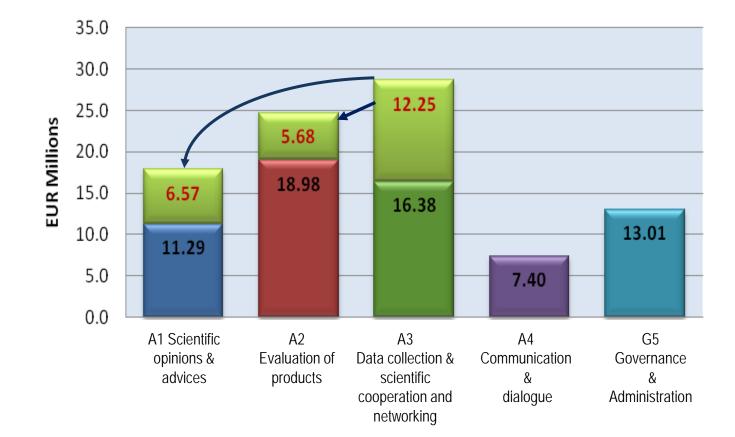

Budget allocation





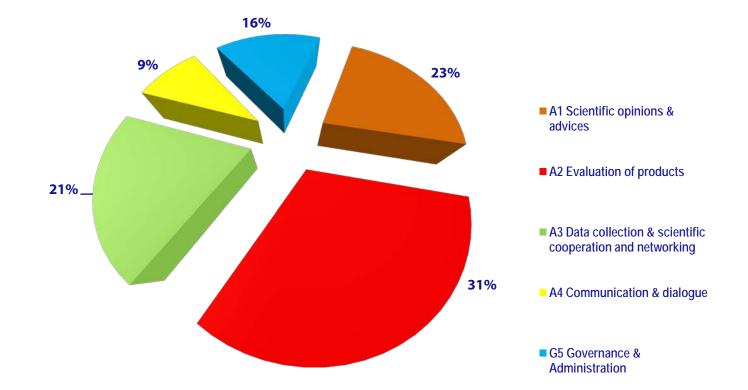
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2012 Budget for Cooperation



- Grant and Procurement Programme increased from 8.3 M in 2011 to 11.3M in 2012
- Strengthening of the Scientific Cooperation programme in the following areas:
 - Applications on food contact materials
 - Increased support for the re-evaluation of food/feed additives and scientific assistance in post-marketing monitoring of food additive
 - development of harmonised methodologies for the data collection, analysis and reporting
 - GMO and Genetically Modified Microorganisms (GMM) applications, data collection and methodology development of GMO risk assessment, including post-marketing monitoring programmes and environmental impact
 - Preparatory work for engaging MSs for implementation of Novel food regulation
