1. OPENING AND APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

The Chair welcomed everyone. Apologies were received from John Griffin, Arie Havelaar, Hilde Kruse and Christophe Nguyen-The.

2. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The agenda was adopted.

3. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no new declarations of interest.

4. NEW REQUESTS TO EFSA/BIOHAZ

4.1. GENETIC TSE RESISTANCE IN GOATS

An urgent request was received from the Commission for an opinion on genetic TSE resistance in goats. The Commission presented the mandate, explained the reasons for the short deadline, and responded to questions on clarification.

4.2. REQUEST TO AHAW PANEL ON *ECHINOCOCUS MULTILOCULARIS* AND EFSA REPLY

A request was received from the Commission concerning a proposition from a Member State to update the 2007 Opinion of the AHAW Panel on the fox tapeworm. The Executive Director has replied indicating that the data referred to by the MS was already taken into account in the previous opinion.

4.3. SELF-TASK MANDATE ON THE REVISION OF THE GUIDANCE DOCUMENT ON POULTRY DECONTAMINATION

The mandate was presented and the Chair of the Working group appointed.

5. Possible adoptions

5.1. QPS APPROACH FOR ASSESSING THE SAFETY OF MICROORGANISMS INTENTIONALLY ADDED TO THE FOOD CHAIN

The draft opinion was adopted pending some editorial changes.

6. PROGRESS REPORTS AND DISCUSSION ON THE FOLLOWING MANDATES

6.1. EVALUATION OF TSE TESTS

IRMM is now dealing with the pre-evaluation phase, which should be completed during the first months of 2009.

6.2. TECHNICAL GUIDE FOR THE SCIENTIFIC DATA COLLECTION ON ANTIMICROBIAL RESISTANCE WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE USE OF AMTS¹ FOR THE DECONTAMINATION OF POULTRY CARCASSES

The WG met on 23 September. At the request of the Commission, further work is suspended pending a possible revision of the terms of reference, to be notified in January 2009.

6.3. USE AND MODE OF ACTION OF BACTERIOPHAGES IN FOOD PRODUCTION

The draft opinion was presented. Adoption of the opinion is anticipated in January 2009.

6.4. MICROBIOLOGICAL EFFICACY OF FOOD IRRADIATION

The WG is being established and a first meeting is foreseen for February 2009.

6.5. PUBLIC HEALTH SIGNIFICANCE OF METICILLIN RESISTANT STAPHYLOCOCCUS AUREUS (MRSA)

The draft opinion was presented for comments. An extension to the deadline for adoption has been granted, adoption being foreseen in March 2009.

6.6. QUANTITATIVE ESTIMATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH IMPACT OF SETTING A NEW TARGET FOR THE REDUCTION OF *SALMONELLA* IN BREEDING HENS

The table of contents of the draft opinion was presented. The next meeting of the working group will be on 17 December 2009. Adoption of the draft opinion is foreseen for March 2009.

6.7. QUANTITATIVE ESTIMATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH IMPACT OF SETTING A NEW TARGET FOR THE REDUCTION OF SALMONELLA IN LAYING HENS

The approach to addressing this mandate will be elaborated at the WG meeting on 13 March 2009. The possibility for outsourcing part of the work is being investigated.

6.8. QUANTITATIVE ESTIMATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH IMPACT OF SETTING A NEW TARGET FOR THE REDUCTION OF *SALMONELLA* IN BROILERS

This mandate has not yet been addressed by the WG due to the prioritisation of mandates covered under points 6.7 and 6.8 above. The approach to be adopted will be addressed at the WG meeting in March 2009.

6.9. REQUEST FOR AN UPDATE AND QUANTIFICATION OF THE RISK POSED BY CAMPYLOBACTER IN BROILER MEAT PRODUCTION

The first meeting was held on 27-28 November 2008. The proposed structure of the document was presented. The new working group meeting will be on 10-11 February 2009.

6.10. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE ON THE LINK BETWEEN SALMONELLA CRITERIA AT DIFFERENT STAGES OF THE POULTRY PRODUCTION CHAIN

The first meeting of the WG was held on 3 October. The data provided through a call was reviewed. An outsourced project is being initiated.

6.11. SPECIAL MEASURES TO REDUCE THE RISK FOR CONSUMERS THROUGH SALMONELLA IN TABLE EGGS – E.G. COOLING OF TABLE EGGS

The working group met on the 3 December. The draft opinion was discussed in detail and modifications proposed. The draft opinion will be presented at the January plenary with a view to adoption.

6.12. QMRA ON SALMONELLA IN SLAUGHTER AND BREEDING PIGS

The table of contents of the draft opinion was presented. The Commission has identified a contractor for outsourcing the cost-benefit analysis for slaughter pigs. The work of the cost-benefit analysis will be coordinated with that of the WG. Adoption will probably be delayed due to delays foreseen in the delivery of the breeder pigs baseline study. An intermediate report on slaughter pigs is foreseen in June 2009. Next meeting is planned for January 2009.

6.13. FOOD SAFETY ASPECTS FROM THE WELFARE OF DAIRY COWS

A combined food safety chapter addressing all four related AHAW opinions will be prepared.

6.14. THE USE OF ANTIBIOTIC RESISTANCE GENES AS MARKER GENES IN GENETICALLY MODIFIED PLANTS

An update on the progress of the joint BIOHAZ-GMO working group was presented. Following a request from EFSA, the Commission has agreed to extend the deadline for the opinion to March 2009. A draft of the opinion will be presented to the panel for discussion in the January plenary.

6.15. FUELCAL® TECHNOLOGY AS NEW ALTERNATIVE METHOD OF DISPOSAL OR USE OF ${\bf ABP}$

The necessary information has now been received, and the working group can now commence its work.

6.16. ABP BUNKER SYSTEM FOR CARCASS TREATMENT

The necessary information has now been received, and the working group can now commence its work.

6.17. ABP ALTERNATIVE METHOD FROM EUROPEAN LIME ASSOCIATION (EULA)

The necessary information has now been received, and the working group can now commence its work.

6.18. UPDATE BSE MONITORING REGIME FOR EU 15, SLOVENIA AND CYPRUS

The first WG meeting will be held in January.

7. FEED BACK FROM THE SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE AND FROM OTHER WGS

The 32nd Plenary meeting of the Scientific Committee was held on 25-26 July².

10.3. JOINT WORKSHOP WITH MS ON THE ASSESSMENT OF ALTERNATIVE METHODS FOR PROCESSING ABPS

The Panel was informed on the workshop that was held on 17 November, in order to advise the MS on compiling the dossiers on alternative methods for processing animal by-products, before submission.

10.4. Uncertainty in Risk Assessment

The Panel's attention was drawn to the opinion of the Scientific Committee on Uncertainties in Dietary Exposure Assessment (EFSA-Q-2004-019)

10.5. FEEDBACK FROM INDUSTRIES ON FEEDINGSTUFFS

A letter was received from the European Feed Manufacturers Federation (FEFAC) providing detailed comments on the recently published BIOHAZ opinion on Microbiological Risk Assessment in feedingstuffs for food producing animals. EFSA will reply, thanking the Federation for their detailed comments. If appropriate, a corrigendum to the opinion will be published; this will not affect the conclusions and recommendations.
