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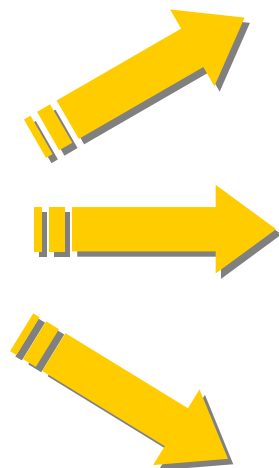

Improving EU food safety

Re-building consumer confidence in EU food safety

Re-building confidence of trading partners in the EU food supply

Why EFSA

- ✓ Food scandals of the late 1990
- ✓ BSE, Dioxin
- ✓ 1997 – Commission separated functions into 2 DGs
- ✓ White Paper on Food Safety-12th January 2000
- ✓ 84 new legislative acts envisage
- ✓ WTO – SPS Agreement – differ from International standards – need robust scientific risk assessments

Regulation 178/2002

- ✓ **General Food Law**
- ✓ **Crisis Procedures / RASFF**
- ✓ **Creation of the European Food Safety Authority**
- ✓ **Creation of new Standing Committees**

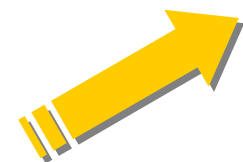
WHAT EFSA CAN DO

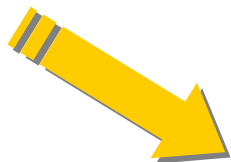

WHAT EFSA **CANNOT** DO

- ✗ Be responsible for food safety policy and legislation
- ✗ Take charge of food safety controls, labelling or other such issues
- ✗ Act as a substitute for national authorities

WHAT EFSA CAN DO

- ✓ **Act as a centre of scientific information and data for the control authorities across the EU**
- ✓ **Be the point of reference of food and feed safety matters for food control officials**
- ✓ **Provide information to support the work of veterinarians, and other control officials**

SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE & PANELS

EFSA's risk assessments carried out by Scientific Committee and 9 Scientific Panels

- Food additives, flavourings, processing aids, materials in contact with food (AFC)
- Additives and products in animal feed (FEEDAP)
- Plant Protection Products (PPR)
- Plant Health Panel (PLH)
- Genetically modified organisms (GMO)
- Dietetic products, nutrition and allergies (NDA)
- Biological hazards (BIOHAZ)
- Contaminants in the food chain (CONTAM)
- Animal Health and Welfare (AHAW)

EFSA RISK ASSESSMENT TASKS

- ✓ Providing scientific opinions
- ✓ Developing risk assessment methodologies
- ✓ Identifying and characterising emerging risks
- ✓ Providing support in food safety crises
- ✓ Collection, collation and analysis of scientific data

EFSA RISK COMMUNICATION TASKS

- ✓ Initiation and coordination of dialogue between stakeholders at appropriate times
- ✓ Provision of the right information to consumers, government, industry, NGO and other stakeholders at the right time
- ✓ Provision of effective support to risk managers during food safety crises
- ✓ Ensuring effective use of information and communications tools

EFSA's Relationships

Member States National Agencies

- ✓ Part of our Networks
- ✓ Members of the Advisory Forum
- ✓ Undertaking Work on our behalf in some cases
- ✓ Ask us to look at scientific questions
- ✓ Try and resolve scientific differences of opinion

EFSA's Relationships

European Commission

- ✓ We provide the scientific opinions to the Commission and its role is to make proposals for legislation
- ✓ Ask us the Majority of scientific questions
- ✓ Work together in a food or feed crisis

EFSA's Relationships

European Parliament

- ✓ Has asked us some scientific questions
- ✓ Major say in EFSA's budget
- ✓ Involved in legislative process (especially Co-Decision procedures)
- ✓ EFSA maintains constant presence in EP
