Scope of the review by by Economisti Associati



- Relevance, effectiveness, efficiency and proportionality;
- Compliance with the Policy on Independence;
- Contribution to EFSA's reputation;
- Room for correction, clarification or simplification of the rules in place;
- Need for amendments following applicability of the Transparency Regulation;
- Need for change following policy developments;

Activities undertaken



- Desk review (over 70 documents);
- Interview programme (19 semi-structured interviews); and
- Web-based survey (22 EFSA staff members).

Main Findings



- Relevance and coherence The Decision on Competing Interest Management complies with the principles outlined in the Policy on Independence in all areas.
- Effectiveness and impact on reputation Accuracy of assessment of
 Declarations of interest and EFSA capacity of detecting conflict of interest increased
 EFSA's reputation in preventing conflict of interest also improved.
- Efficiency and room for simplification Positive assessment of the semicentralised screening process and high appreciation of the IT tool - little room for improvement as compared to the previous situation.
- Proportionality and sustainability in light of the Transparency Regulation broadening of sourcing model might require need to revise holistic screening criteria.
- **Policy changes** a considerable degree of harmonisation reached on the main principles underlying conflict of interest prevention among "life sciences" European Union agencies.

What is next - I



Opportunity for clarification of current CIM rules regarding:

- Concept of "Risk management";
- Concept of "Industry employment";
- Concept of "Public institution";
- Concept of "Indirect interests";
- Concept of "Expert's own work";
- Simplification of procedures applicable for less relevant cases of breach of the rules or omissions.

Opportunity for further IT improvements including:

- Extending online IT tool to procurement and grants;
- Automatic elimination of outdated interests.

What is next - II



- Independence Policy review (by July 2023)
 - concepts of close family members and financial interest and employment with non-governmental organisations;
 - hearing experts' DoI submission requirement and involvement;
 - requirements for public institutions;
 - explicit rules on participation to closed and other industry sponsored events;
 - cooling-off provisions applicable to various actors.
- Draft Decision on the Prevention and Management of Conflicting Interest of staff members.
