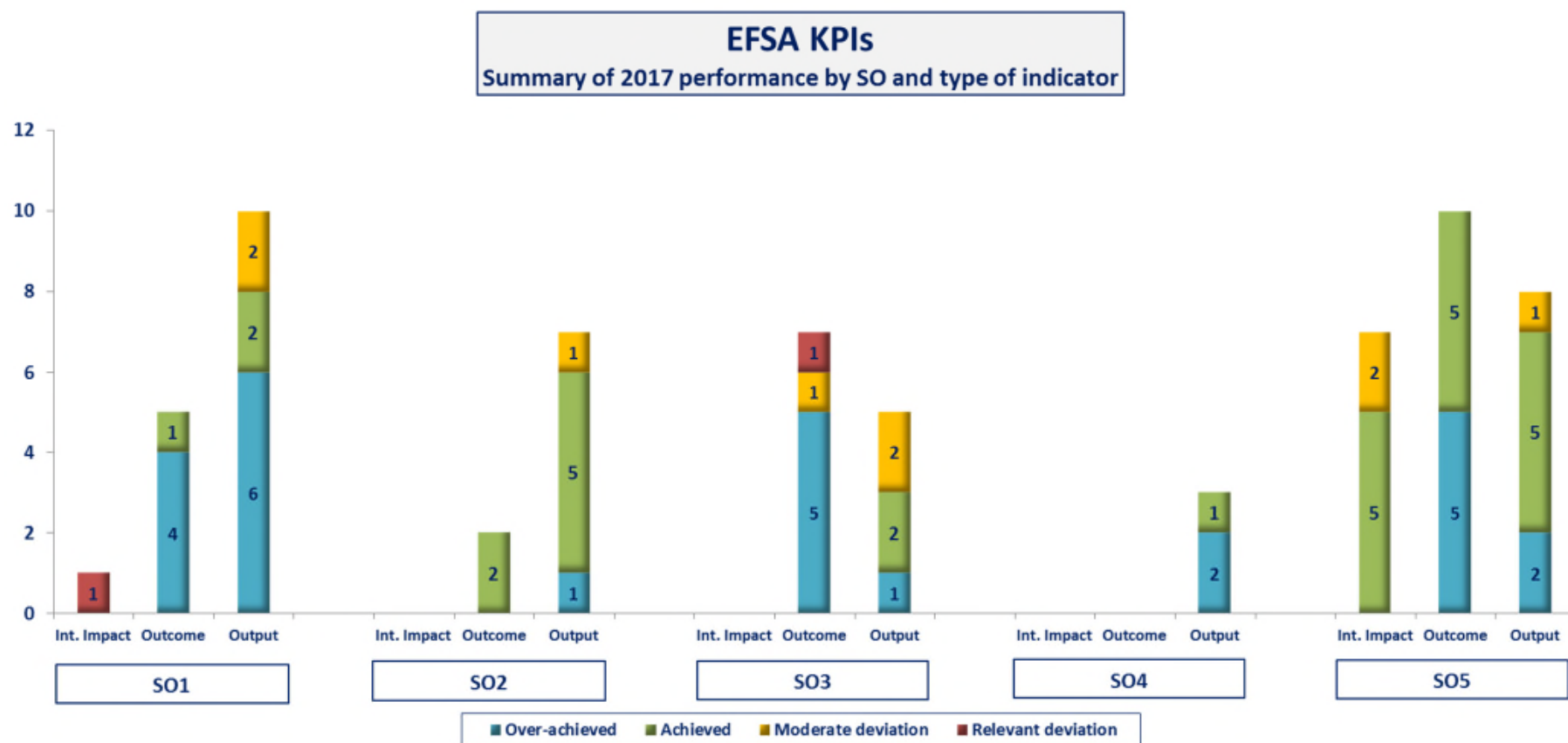

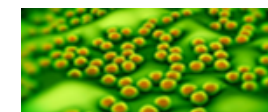
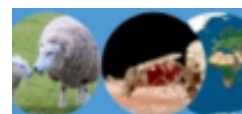
P4 PERFORMANCE SNAPSHOT per SO and Type of Indicator

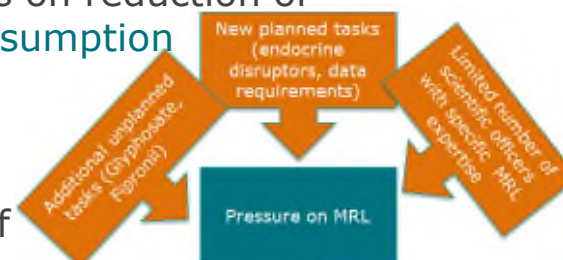
□ General risk assessment

□ Stakeholders' engagement and communication

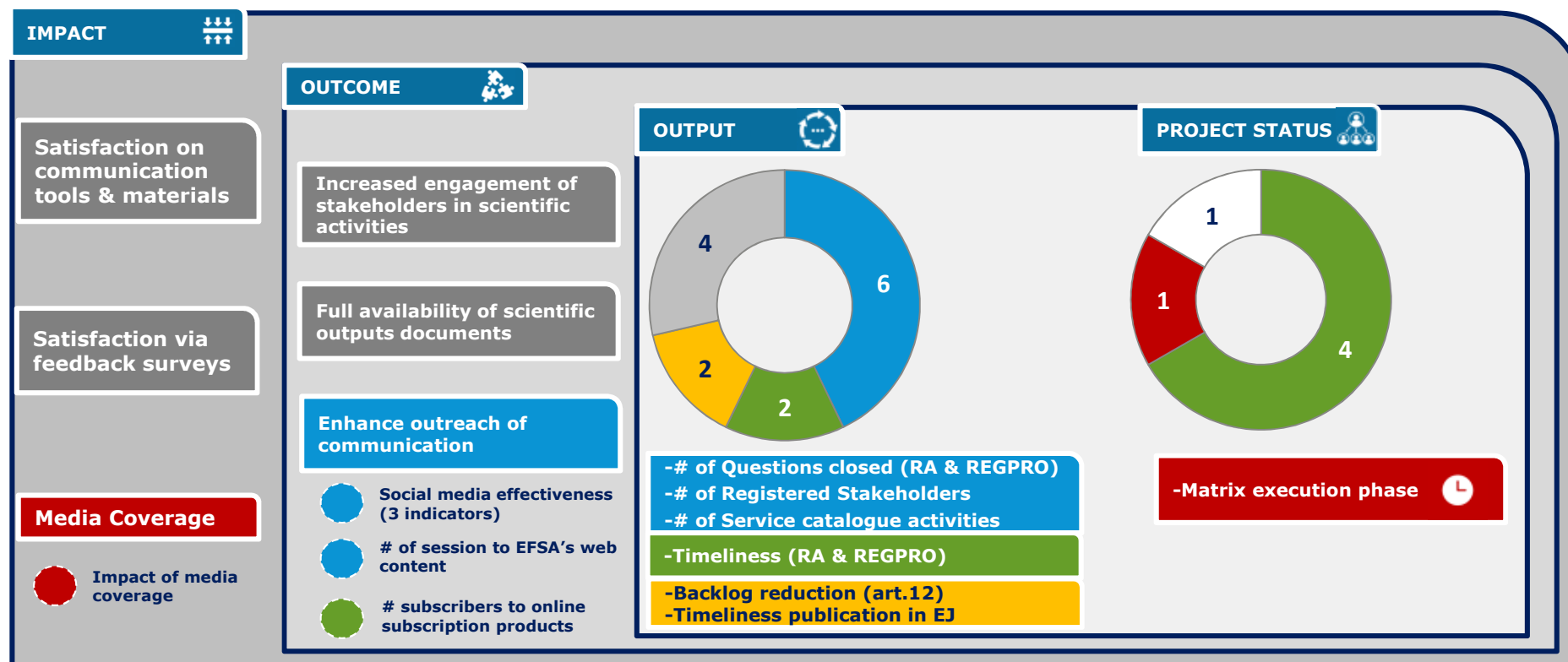
- 1st stakeholders Forum with over 50 participants

Improvement in production of EU summary reports, SDWH, RASA roadmap project



- More **quality**
- Better **timeliness**
- Less **budget**
- Less **FTEs**
- More **output**

- ❑ **# of questions adopted per year:** increased by **75%**
from 2 in 2014 to 3.5 in 2015-2017 due to the addition of the annual summary report of TSE and the JIACRA bi-annual report
- ❑ **# of FTEs needed:** the total number of FTEs decreased by **26%**
on an yearly basis the FTE/report ratio shrank by 58%
from 4.3 FTEs/report in 2014 to 1.8 FTEs/report in 2015-2017
- ❑ **budget needed:** total budget allocated to the production of summary reports decreased by 42%
the cost per report (excluding meetings) decreased from €450k to € 262k (-67%)
- ❑ **Quality increase:**
 - Improved timeliness (report to EC and data to MS)
 - Improved complexity and comprehensibility of the outputs

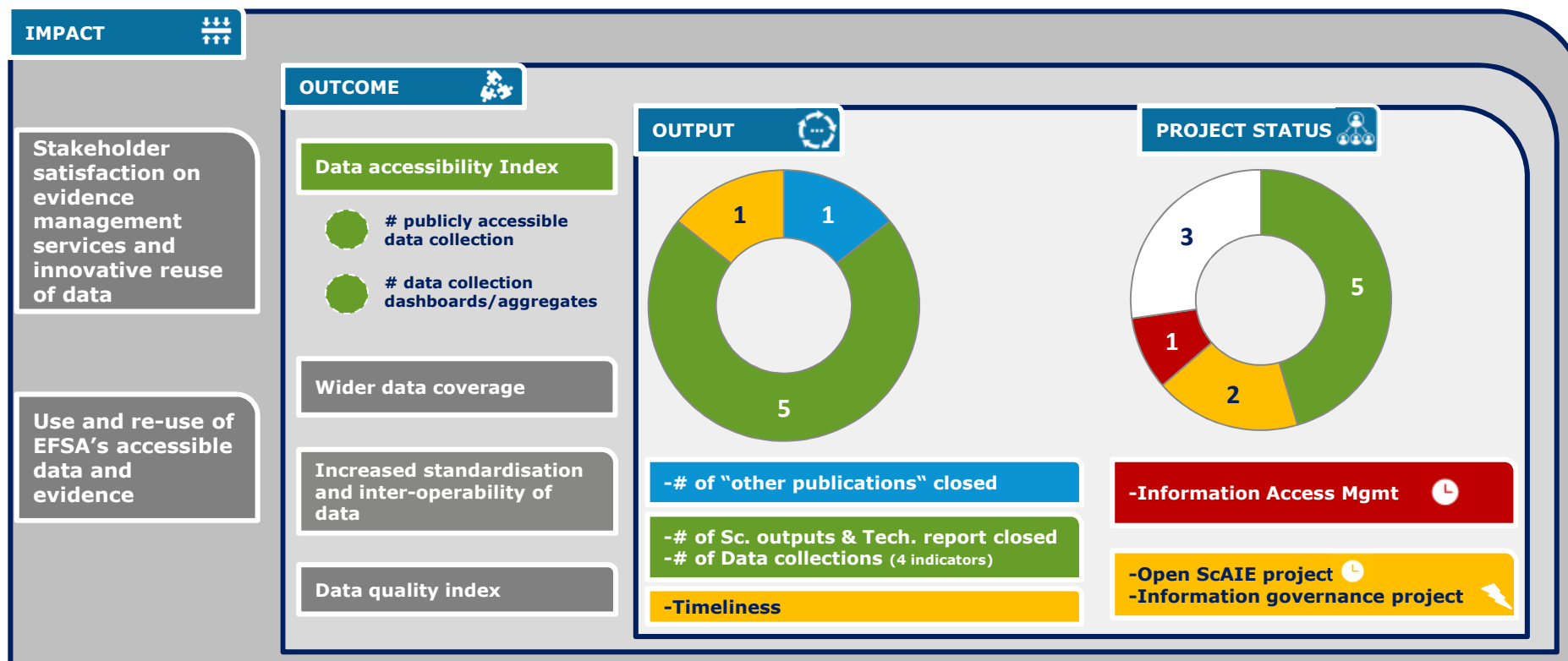

Investments in data collection process (SDWH project) led to efficiency gains re-invested in the data collection process

❑ **More data collections**

16 fully operational processes available (7 in 2014)

❑ **FTEs savings**

Total FTEs decreased by 2.1
From 12.3 in 2014 to 10.2 in 2017

❑ **Budget savings**

Direct budget decreased by 65%
Cost per operational process from €91k in 2014 to €32k in 2017

❑ **Quality increase**

Single SDWH allows integrated analysis, self-service forms, increased data standardisation

❑ **Net savings**

≈20% of the cost of the process

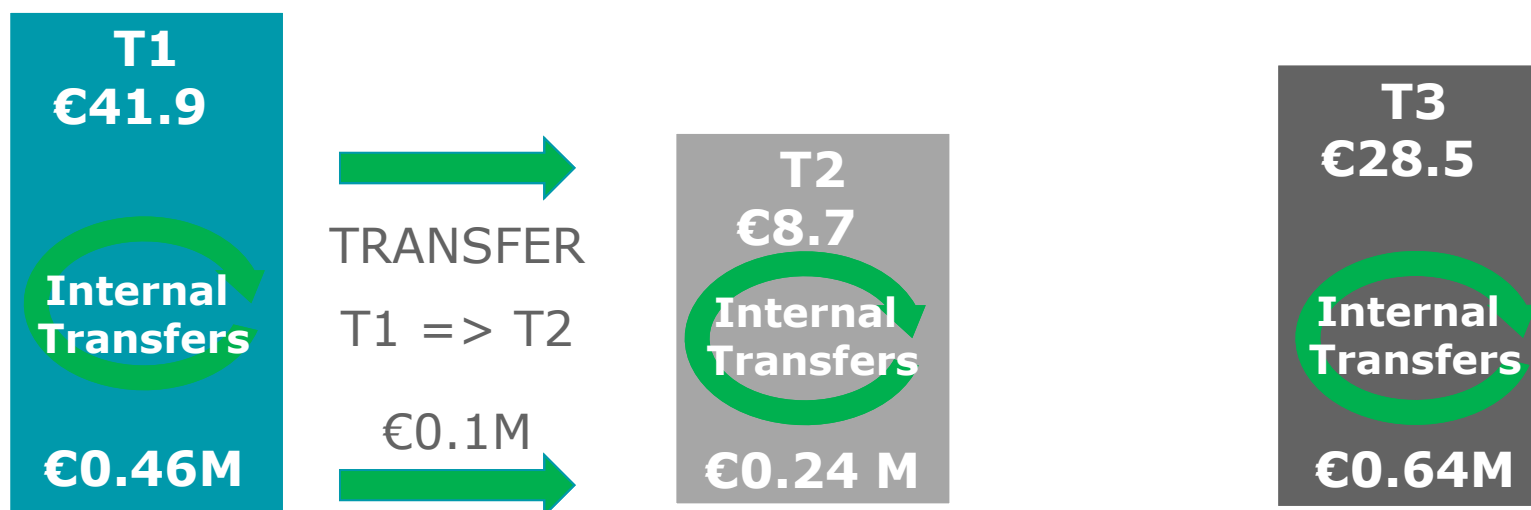


BUDGET EXECUTION AND TRANSFERS

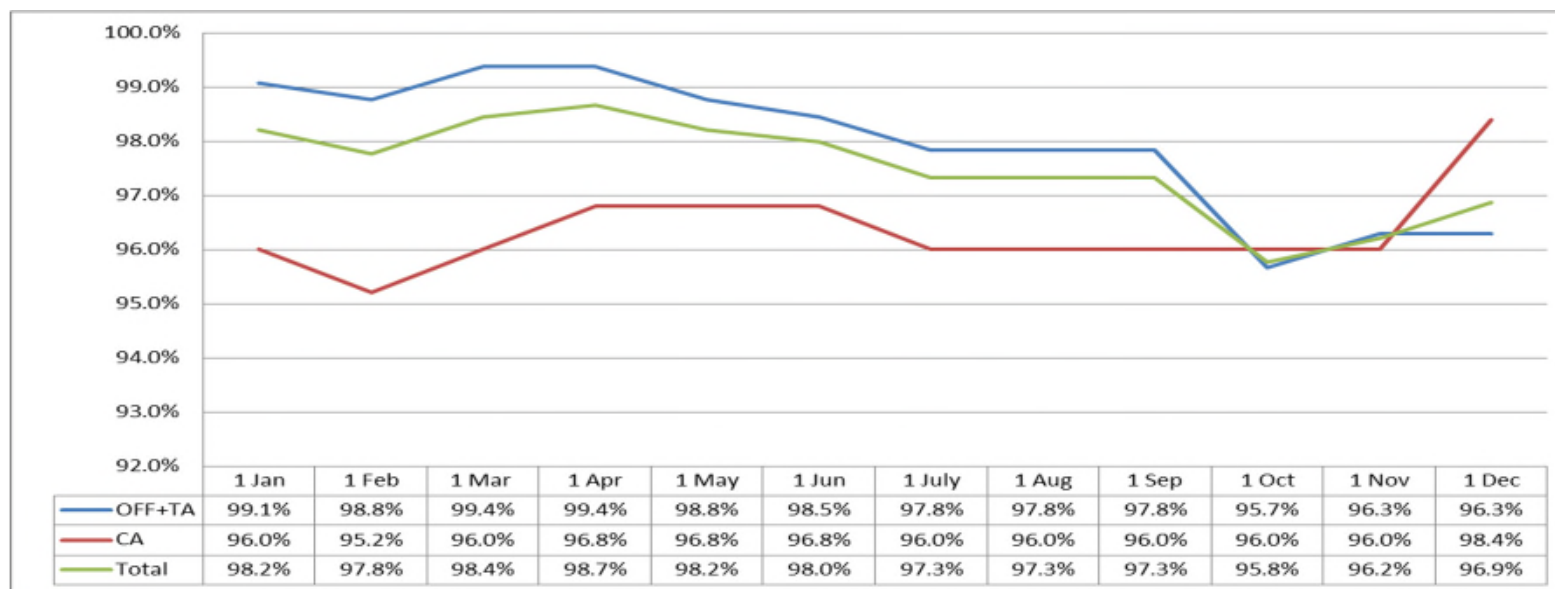
