



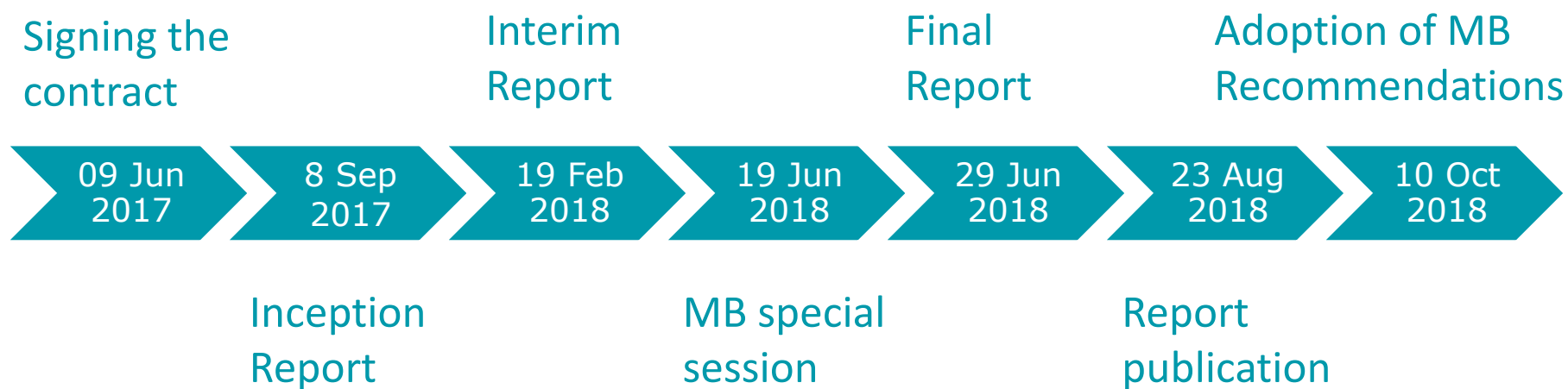
Management Board recommendations stemming from the 3rd External Evaluation of EFSA

Management Board Meeting
10 October 2018

OVERVIEW OF THE EVALUATION

- Takes place every 6 years as outlined in Art.61 of EFSA's Founding Regulation
- Starting point the 2nd External Evaluation and the related Management Board recommendations
- Evaluates EFSA's working practices and the impact of its activities in terms of relevance, effectiveness, efficiency, coherence, complementarity and EU added value
- Six year period 2011-2016 and extend as appropriate to 2018
- Evaluation team consisted of experts from Coffey and Ramboll, complemented by risk assessment experts
- Timeline: June 2017–June 2018

DRAFT MANAGEMENT BOARD RECOMMENDATIONS 1/6

1. Enhance capacity for fit-for purpose and responsive scientific advice

- Improved planning and responsiveness
- Optimise the use of resources
- Harmonise EU assessments
- Utilize technological development in IT and data management

2. Enhance communication activities to strengthen EFSA's reputation

- Increase proactivity of communication
- Communicate collaboratively
- Contextualize communication to address societal concerns and use communication science to improve communication about risk assessment

3. Secure long-term efficiency and sustainability of EFSA's operations

- Enhance efficiency of the advice production system
- Find additional ways to utilize expertise
- Increase EFSA's financial resources

4. Continue EFSA's transformation to an Open Science Organisation

- Make evidence transparent and re-usable
- Make the advice-development process accessible
- Enhance the dialogue with stakeholders
- Safeguard and explain EFSA's scientific independence

5. Invest in preparedness to cope with complex futures

- Scan emerging risks and co-develop adequate assessment methodologies
- Co-develop European capacity for future risk governance
- Co-influence EU research funding priorities

6. Collaborate, cooperate and co-design to meet integrated "One Health" protection targets

- Upgrade collaboration to a strategic level
- Utilize the opportunities of big data
