
European Council Conclusions, 24-25 October 2013

'Open data is an untapped resource with a huge potential for building stronger, more interconnected societies that better meet the needs of the citizens and allow innovation and prosperity to flourish. Interoperability and the re-use of public sector information shall be promoted actively' **US Executive Order**

Government information open and machine readable by default





Why an EU Open Data Portal?

Single point of access for EU Open Data

 Harmonised way to describe metadata, improvement of data management across the board


- Search
 - Human search interface (Catalogue, SPARQL endpoint)
 - Machine-to-machine search (API, SPARQL endpoint)

 Engagement with data consumer community (Surveys, Social media, Give feedback, Suggest datasets, Share apps based on EU data)

Who publishes on the EU Open Data Portal?

- 26 Commission services

23 Agencies









